

INTODUCTION BY WAGING PEACE CO-EXESTIVE DIRECTRS, SONJA MILEY AND MADDY CROWTHER

After more than two years of planning, cocreating, peacebuilding, lifting each other, and collaborating with Sudanese women in the UK, alongside Waging Peace staff and volunteers, our Peace by Piece project (aka the 'giant toub*') reached its completed form as of November 2024.

This booklet is our effort to document the process of peacebuilding, from our first workshop launch in November 2022, to the journey of the giant toub over the past two years. The Peace by Piece project is evidence of what can be achieved when women come together.

Let us take a moment to remember the beginning, at our first workshop in November 2022, when we introduced the concept of Peace by Piece. The images of many women working together at the Stowe Centre in London, creating the first pieces, was nothing less than magical. 25 Sudanese women from all over the UK, from various regions of Sudan originally, believed in the idea and travelled near and far to take part. At the end of the workshop the first nine 'pieces' were born. Passion, peacebuilding, and perseverance has grown the giant toub into its final size which is now 6 metres (width) by 3 metres (height), with over 75 individual pieces and a banner at the top!

*A 'toub' is a style of Sudanese women's clothing.





The giant toub is a stunning piece of artwork as well as an influential advocacy tool highlighting the powerful voices of Sudanese women calling for more light and attention to be shined on Sudan. Each piece calls for courage, unity, equity for all Sudanese, love of country, sisterhood, bridging divides, visibility, hope; all firmly embedded in the understanding that each voice is unique and carries its own compelling story of struggle and pain.

In each distinct form, every piece of fabric was lovingly and meticulously stitched together by Liela Musa Medani. Every stitch binding one piece to another, creating this rich tapestry full of diversity. In binding pieces together, the essence of the Peace by Piece project took clearer form, symbolising re-connection, rebuilding, claiming oneself, and understanding one another.

This is a gift to Sudanese women from Sudanese women, a tribute to each other and the sacrifices made to stand up courageously in the name of peace throughout Sudan's history which includes revolutions and wars.

So far the giant toub has been seen in many media pieces, viewed by HM King Charles III, twice displayed in the Palace of Westminster, and seen by Parliamentarians and diplomats. It has attended Sudanese and other community events, Peace by Piece sewing circles and Sudanese women's groups, university talks about Sudan, and she has proudly shined her beauty through the streets of central London during a march on International Women's Day.

We will continue to celebrate the giant toub and ensure the voices of Sudanese women are heard by decision makers, included in exhibitions, cultural days, school assemblies, and more. For now, let us remember how far we have come, together.



The objective of the project is to build a peacebuilding network of Sudanese women throughout the UK whose focus is empowerment, combating isolation and loneliness, creating and engaging in a safe space, encouragement towards new opportunities, and skills sharing. We aim to do this through peacebuilding exercises, discussion, mental health support, dancing!, challenging women to reach beyond the known by travelling outside their immediate environments, networking, and through working together to emphasise the uniqueness and power of Sudanese women, individually and collectively.

Sudanese women are encouraged to artistically design and decorate a piece of fabric in small groups. When




